Setting voicemail and listening to voicemails in MultiLine

Read this to set up your voicemail. Learn how to record your voicemail greeting and listen to voicemails.

Overview

The MultiLine application provides you a separate voicemail to use for your business calling. You have three options: the default message, a custom message, and a message that includes audio of you speaking your name.

Before you start

- You need to be connected to the internet when updating your Voicemail greeting.
- Your organization can turn off voicemail features. If so, you may not see all the options described here.

Record your Voicemail greeting

Use Voicemail Greeting from the Settings menu to set up a voicemail greeting.

- 1. Tap Settings.
- 2. Tap Voicemail Greeting.
- 3. You have three options for setting your Voicemail Greeting:







Listen to Voicemails

Your voicemail messages appear alongside SMS messages in Messages. Tap a voicemail message to open the message in the voicemail message player.

- 1. Go to **Messages** and find a Voicemail message. *Voicemail messages are indicated by voicemail icons*

- 2. Tap anywhere to expose the options.



- 3. The voicemail message player has several options for playback:
 - Play/Pause: Tap Play/Pause icon to start and stop the voicemail message playback.
 - Speaker: Tap to use the speaker phone to play the message.
 - Call: Tap to call the party back.



- Speech-bubble: Tap to message the party back.
- (1) Info: Tap to pull up the Contact Details page. *Tip: You can go to Contact Details to see history with the contact, or message the party back.*






Listen to Voicemails

2. Tap the menu down arrow to expose the options, then tap Play.


Overview

You can listen to voicemails from MultiLine Desktop. To set your voicemail message, use the mobile MultiLine app.

Listen to Voicemail

The first time you dial your voicemail you'll need to set up your voicemail password. The automated system will guide you through the steps.

- 1. Go to the **Dialer** screen.
- 2. Long press on 1 for a few seconds until it begins dialing your voicemail.



3. When prompted, dial your voicemail password.

You'll be able to listen to each voicemail, repeat, and delete voicemails.

Teams

You can listen to voicemails in Microsoft Teams connector. To set your voicemail message, use the MultiLine mobile app.


Listen to voicemail

You can listen to voicemails from the Voicemail tab in your call history.

1. Go to Calls and select Voicemail from the History menu.



2. Select the log to access the **Details** panel.



3. Select the **Play** icon under the voicemail transcript to listen to the message.
